TODAY'S GOSPEL READING

The story of Jesus in the home of Martha and Mary complements the story of the Good Samaritan, which immediately precedes it in Luke's Gospel. Both stories are unique to Luke. The story of the Samaritan opens with the words "a certain man."

Today's reading opens with the words "a certain woman." The Samaritan is an example of how a disciple should see and act. Mary is an example of how a disciple should listen. Mary, a woman, is a marginalized person in society, like the Samaritan. Both do what is not expected of them. As a woman, Mary would be expected, like Martha, to prepare hospitality for a guest. Here again Jesus breaks with the social conventions of his time. Just as a Samaritan would not be a model for neighborliness, so a woman would not sit with the men around the feet of a teacher.

Both stories exemplify how a disciple is to fulfill the dual command which begins chapter 10—love of God (Mary) and love of neighbor (the Samaritan). These are the two essentials of life in the kingdom. By using the examples of a Samaritan and a woman, however, Jesus is saying something more. Social codes and boundaries were strict in Jesus' time. Yet to love God with all one's heart and one's neighbor requires breaking those rules. The Kingdom of God is a society without distinctions and boundaries between its members. It is a society that requires times for seeing and doing and also times for listening and learning at the feet of a teacher.

Saints of the Week

Mon, Jul 21: St. Lawrence of Brindisi, Priest, Doctor.

Lawrence, died 1619; Capuchin, linguist, military chaplain, diplomat, and minister general; learnt exegesis, forceful preacher and controversialist; fifteen volumes of his writings are extant.

Tues, Jul 22: St. Mary Magdalene.

Mary Magdalene, died 1st c.; healed of possession; disciple of Jesus and present at his crucifixion; in Mark, the first to witness to the risen Lord (hence, called the "Apostle of the Apostles"); patroness of the Order of Preachers.

Wed, Jul 23: St. Bridget of Sweden, Religious.

Bridget, died 1373 in Rome; born in Sweden, mother of eight; mystic prophet and foundress of the Order of the Most Holy Savior ("Brigettines"); sought to end the luxury and dissipation of the Avignon papacy and the return of the pope to Rome; her *Revelations* record her spiritual experiences and life; patroness of Sweden; together with Teresa Benedicta of the Cross and Catherine of Siena, declared co-patroness of Europe.

Thurs, Jul 24: St. Sharbel Makhluf, Priest.

Sharbel was a Lebanese monk, born in a small mountain village and ordained in 1858. Devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary, he spent the last twenty-three years of his life as a hermit. Despite temptations to wealth and comfort, Sharbel taught the value of poverty, self-sacrifice, and prayer by the life he lived. He possessed the gift of performing miracles even during his lifetime. His tomb at the monastery of St. Maron in Annaya, Lebanon, is a place of pilgrimage. Canonized by Pope Paul, VI in 1977, Sharbel is known as the "Hermit of Lebanon."

Fri, Jul 25: St. James, Apostle.

James, brother of John, is called "the Greater" because he followed Christ before the other apostle of the same name; first of the Twelve to be martyred, being decapitated by order of Herod Agrippa I, c. 44; venerated at Compostella, Spain; patron of pilgrims, of Spain, Guatemala and Nicaragua.

Sat, Jul 26: St. Joachim and St. Anne, Parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Names for the parents of Mary found in the 2nd c. *Protoevangelium of James*; veneration of Anne originated in the 6th c. East; patroness of childless women and miners; devotion to Joachim dates from the 8th c.; patron of fathers and grandparents.
