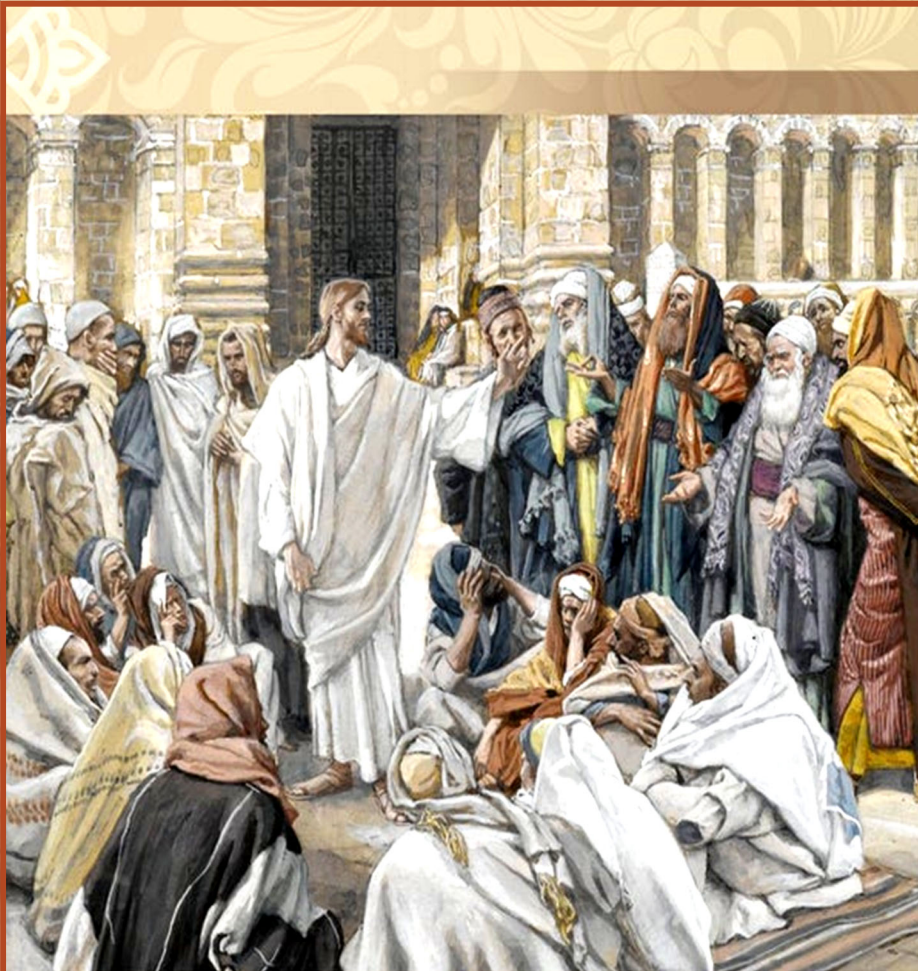

Dear Parishioners,

A few reminders for all of us as we gather for Sunday Mass. I found the following list, "*Etiquette for Participating at Sunday Mass*," particularly helpful in reminding ourselves of the sacredness of the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Jesus in our midst.

► Make Sunday truly the Lord's Day.

Schedule your family activities and commitments around Mass—not the other way around.

Let Sunday be your family day with the Lord.

► Prepare for Mass before you leave home.

This helps you arrive on time and enter into the liturgy with a prayerful spirit.

► Participate fully, consciously, and actively.

Listen attentively to the readings and the homily.

Respond with the proper acclamations.

Join in the singing with the choir and the congregation.

► Be respectful during Mass.

Dress modestly and appropriately—remember, we are in the presence of the Lord.

Keep a reverent silence before and after Mass for those who are praying.

► Be reverent during the liturgy.

Silence your phone before entering the Church.

Refrain from eating, drinking (except water when needed), or chewing gum.

Bow before the Altar when entering the Church acknowledging Jesus' Presence in the tabernacle.

Receive Holy Communion with both spiritual and physical reverence:

Bow before receiving the Body and Blood of Christ.

Respond clearly and confidently with "Amen" as your profession of faith in His Real Presence.

► Remain until the Mass is truly ended.

Do not leave before the final blessing. Often, there are important parish announcements that remind us of our belonging to a community of faith.

► Live out the grace you've received.

The presider sends us forth with a blessing to carry out our Christian mission in the world—strengthened and nourished by Jesus' presence.

► Let your Sunday joy carry into the week.

Preach the Gospel through your words and deeds. Share your blessings with those in need. Let others experience the love and presence of Christ through you.

Let us continue to grow together as a Eucharistic people, always honoring the sacred gift we celebrate each Sunday.

Saints & Special Observances of the Week

Mon, Aug 4: St. John Mary Vianney, Priest.

Jean-Baptiste Marie Vianney, died 1859; universally known as the "Curé of Ars"; compassionate spiritual counselor who spent no less than eleven hours every day in the confessional in winter, sixteen in the summer; patron of priests and the parish clergy.

Tues, Aug 5: The Dedication of the Basilica of Saint Mary Major in Rome.

Following the declaration of Mary as "God-bearer" by the Council of Ephesus in 431, Pope Sixtus III erected in Rome this oldest basilica in the West dedicated to the Mother of God.

Wed, Aug 6: The Transfiguration of the Lord.



Celebrated by 5th c. East Syrians, this feast was inserted into the general calendar in 1457 by Pope Callistus III to celebrate the defeat, announced in Rome on August 6, of the Turks at Belgrade. (August 6 occurs forty days before the feast of the Triumph of the Cross, September 14).

Thurs, Aug 7: St. Sixtus II, Pope, Martyr, and Companions, Martyrs; St. Cajetan, Priest.

Sixtus II and four deacons (Januarius, Vincent, Magnus, and Stephen) were arrested on August 6, 258 while celebrating the Eucharist in the cemetery of Callistus; by order of Valerian, they were decapitated that same day.

Cajetan, died 1547; from Venice; co-founded (1524) with Gian Pietro Carafa (later Pope Paul IV) the Theatines (today, the Congregation of Clerks Regular, who number about 175 religious; devoted to reform, prayer, and ministry to the poor and the sick.

Fri, Aug 8: St. Dominic, Priest.

Dominic de Guzman, died August 6, 1221; born in Caleruega, Spain; founded the Order of Preachers, today numbering some 5,770 religious; an elective, fraternal form of community life devoted to contemplation, study and preaching.

Sat, Aug 9: St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein), Virgin, Martyr.

Edith Stein, died 1942; born of Jewish parents in 1891; influential philosopher and convert to Catholicism; entered the Discalced Carmelites in 1933; arrested by the Nazis in 1942 and transported by cattle train to the death camp of Auschwitz where she died in the gas chambers.

"Come," Edith gently whispered, taking her sister Rosa's hand, "let us go for our people!" These were Edith Stein's last words as the Nazis, enraged at the Dutch bishops' condemnation of their genocide, took into custody all Catholic converts from Judaism. Born Jewish, but non-practicing from her teens, Edith's search for truth led to a doctorate in philosophy, a brilliant career as professor and author and, finally, to the *Autobiography of Saint Teresa of Ávila*, which she read in one sitting, then declared, "That is the Truth!" Baptized on January 1, 1922, observed then as the feast of Jesus' initiation into the covenant of Abraham, confirmed on February 2, the feast of Jesus' Presentation in the Temple, Edith entered the cloistered Carmelites in Cologne, transferring to a convent in Holland when she realized that, because of the Nazi persecution of the Jews, her presence could imperil the safety of the other nuns. She died in the gas chambers of Auschwitz as a daughter of Israel and of the Church.

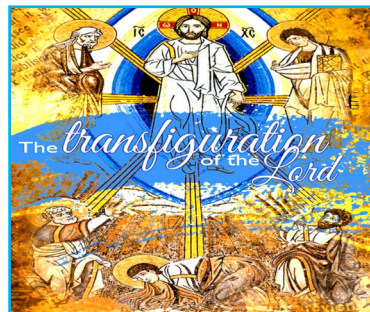
