Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Meals played an important role in the society in which Jesus lived. More than a time for sharing nourishment, they were a time to share ideas and to model different aspects of social relationships. In Luke's Gospel, the places that a person ate (at the home of a tax collector, 5:29), the people with whom a person ate (sinners, 5:30), whether a person washed before eating (11:38), and, as is the case here, the place that a person sits while eating are all important. The narrator says Jesus tells a parable, but it is really wise advice to both guests and hosts about finding true happiness at the heavenly banquet.

Jesus warns guests to wait before taking their places at the table lest they be asked to move if someone more important arrives. This is more than just a lesson about dinner etiquette. It is advice on how to find your true place in the Kingdom of God. Jesus advises hosts not to invite people who would be expected to repay them to dinner but to invite those who could not repay: the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. This is where real blessings can be found.

In these sayings, Luke gives us not only advice on how to approach the end times but also on how to live according to Jesus' vision of a good society. Luke's Gospel also advises us how the Church must be part of bringing about this society. It is yet another example in Luke's Gospel of the reversal the kingdom brings about.

WEEK 1: THE INTRODUCTORY RITES

Next weekend, we begin our special homily series on the parts of the Mass with a focus on the Introductory Rites. These opening moments are not simply a prelude before the "real" Mass begins. The entrance procession, the veneration of the altar, and the Sign of the Cross set the tone: we are entering into holy worship. The greeting, "The Lord be with you," reminds us that Christ Himself is in our midst. The Act of Penance and the Kyrie ("Lord, have mercy") purify our hearts, while the Gloria lifts our praise to God. The Collect gathers all our prayers into one, offered to the Father through Christ.

Next Sunday, Fr. Mark and Fr. Louis will help us rediscover how these opening rites are not routine words but a sacred doorway into the mystery of the Eucharist.

Saint & Special Observance of the Week

Mon, Sep 1: Labor Day.

Labor Day originated in 1882 in New York City under the aegis of the Knights of Labor. Congress made it a legal holiday in 1894. Observing it this week gives us a good opportunity to reflect on the Catholic Church's social teachings for the last century or so.

Wed, Sep 3: St. Gregory the Great, Pope, Doctor of the Church.

Gregory, died March 12, 604; prefect of Rome; O.S.B.; papal legate to Constantinople; as Pope, noted for liturgical reform and chant; sent missionaries to England; wrote on many moral and theological subjects (e.g., *Moralia* on Job, *Dialogues*, and *Pastoral Rule*); one of the four great doctors of the Latin Church; called himself the "servus servorum Dei"; patron saint of music.

Procedure for Infant Baptism

To have your child baptized at the Church of the Resurrection, please follow these steps:

Schedule a meeting

- ▶ Parents must meet with one of our priests and fill out a Baptismal form
- ► Call the parish office at 408-245-5554 to set up an appointment. Submit a copy of the child's birth certificate

Register for a Baptism Class

Parents and godparents must attend a baptism preparation session.

► Register through the parish secretary at 408-245-5554.

Note: Class certification is valid for two years.

Provide proof of completion

Submit a certificate of completion for the baptism preparation class.

Godparent Participation

Godparents are required to be present at the celebration of the Sacrament.

Fee: A \$150 fee is required for baptismal classes and preparation. For questions or additional support, please do not hesitate to contact the parish office. We look forward to accompanying you in welcoming your child into the life of Christ and His Church.
